Who is Abiodun Obakin?



biodun
Obakin, BPW
Abuja is the
MD/CEO of Biobak Kitchen and
Ventures, Abuja, Nigeria. Her
story is indeed a grass to grace
one and she is a source of
inspiration to the thousands of
lives her business and her
person have touched.

Abiodun trained as a Laboratory Scientist (AIMLT in Haematology and Blood Transfusion; FIMLT in Microbiology; MSc in Haematology) and worked for 23 years at the University Teaching Hospital, Ibadan, Nigeria. Her passion for cooking and an all consuming dream of running a restaurant led her to resign from her hospital job to start a small catering outfit which she operated from her home. Her orders hardly exceeded 10 but she kept on giving the best of African dishes to her clients. This was in 1996.

Her breakthrough came in 2003, when she, along with a host of others, won the bid to cater at the All Africa Games (COJA) held in Nigeria that year. Her dishes got rave reviews and this brought her business into the limelight. She decided to take a loan from the bank to set up a small road side eatery which she paid back with a lot of difficulty. Due to land use regulations in Abuja, the capital city, her little restaurant was demolished. Undeterred, Abiodun proceeded to move her business to a more upmarket location. Her vision and tenacity drove her to carry on in business to sustain herself, her family and the community that depended on her. Her business sense eventually paid off: her turnover has risen from \$200,000 dollars (two hundred thousand US dollars) to over \$10 million US dollars a year.

In 2009, she was awarded the Best Restaurant in Abuja. In 2010, she was among the 50 leading business women that President Goodluck Jonathan honoured in Nigeria. The same year, she was also one of the country's representatives at the World Food Expo in USA.

Her business, Biobak Kitchen, has food outreaches to widows, orphanages and the business is also heavily committed to supporting grassroot clubs that support women and children. Abiodun Obakin is a mentor to many women, especially those within the hospitality business.
