Women's Journey to Equality in Canada

The road to equality has been long and difficult. Women fought for the right to vote and in 1884 women in Ontario were granted that right. It took until 1919 before women could vote federally and it was 1960 before Canada's indigenous people were granted that right.

Then when women's rights to hold elected office were challenged women fought again and in 1929, led by the famous 5, women in Canada were declared "Persons" under the law. Women continue that journey today to share all roles equally in Canadian society with men.

In spite of the great efforts of many, including men, to bring equality to the sexes, we are still a society where women are treated differently than men, especially in the workplace. Women have long been uplifting and supporting others. This care was unpaid, and often unnoticed or unappreciated. As women moved from the realms of home to work our society continued this underappreciation which has resulted in lower pay for women. Today in the workforce women can expect to earn 31.5 % less than men, on average. This is known as the Gender Wage Gap.

I didn't initially see the economic argument as the underlying problem that creates the inequities in our society but after hearing BPW International President, Freda Miriklis, speak about this economic aspect, I began to understand the real issue. In a very succinct argument, money is power. If you balance the money, the incomes, you balance the power.

We know that abuse is really about power. When there is an imbalance of power there is more risk of abuse. Therefore we must balance this power and starting with gender wage parity is the primary way to obtain a balance in our society.

Despite the Pay Equity Law enacted in 1986, wages remain one of several ways men and women are treated differently in the workplace. In the last 10 years there has been a great deal of attention to this gap and many countries are now putting measures in place to require employers to analyse their wage gap, and work to close the gap. Encouraging men to share in family caregiver roles, therefore reducing the number of hours women spend out of the workforce on these duties, establishing universal daycare as a way to support our working families and providing flexible work schedules to support parents to sustain a work life balance. These strategies send a clear message that we value families as well as both parents contributing to the economy through employment.

The He for She Campaign is another way communities can work for equality in society. Waterloo University has signed on along with many other Universities and employers. The Ontario Securities Commission now requires Boards of publicly traded companies to consist of 30% women and if they cannot reach that target they must explain why.

The Premier of Ontario has mandated the Minister of Labour to close the gender wage gap in the context of the 21st century workplace. I have been appointed as an external advisor to this steering committee and together we are looking for solutions to close the gap. I feel very fortunate to be a women, to live in Canada and be part of a society where individuals can change the world

To quote Margaret Mead, never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world, indeed, it's the only thing that ever has. Please think about the many ways you can impact our society and get involved, be bold, don't run from the problems of our society, change them.




