Dewali is the biggest holiday worldwide in the Indian culture. Starting from October 30, 2016 and lasting 5 days. It is the festival of lights because of homes, businesses and public places are decorated with very small clay lamps called diyas. Dewali message is "good vs.

evil" light over darkness and knowledge over ignorance. Times of India has summed up the modern meaning of Dewali "regardless of the mythological explanation one prefers, what the festival of lights really stands for today is a reaffirmation of hope, a renewed commitment to friendship and goodwill, and a religiously sanctioned celebration of the simple – and some not simple – joys of life".

## Focus on a Member: Karen Clouter Sheila Walker

n April 30th 1995, Karen left an abusive marriage and moved into a shelter with her two young children. After living there for six weeks, she wanted to give back to the place that gave her so much. Two months later, she organized the very successful fundraiser called the 1st Annual Bethesda House Concert in the Park, which raised over \$3500 for the shelter. This event ran successfully for7 consecutive years.



Karen struggled with weight for most of her teens and all of her adult life. After riding the diet roller coaster for years, she hit rock bottom and made the decision to have gastric bypass surgery. The experience was interesting, exciting and successful but definitely not without its challenges. To date, Karen has lost almost 280lbs. She published her first book "It's My Time – One Women's Journey of Losing Weight and Finding herself. She does motivational speaking to share her story. "If I can help just one person, it was worth writing"

Some of the things that are dear to Karen's heart, she is a Certified ONE Stroke Painting Instructor, Energy Worker, Board Member for Ste, Louise Outreach Food Bank, a Member of the Consumer Council for CMHA Brampton and a Board member of Fear Nothing Association of Ontario, a non profit organization tasked with bringing Mental Health into the light. Their goal is to promote healing and understanding for those suffering Anxiety, Depression and Mental Illness and to ensure they never feel alone.

Karen is a singer/songwriter who has written and recorded two very powerful songs. One is a song of hope and inspiration called "Proud to be a Womyn" and her newest release is "Movin'On"...the theme song for the web talk show Reflection hosted by Ayse Hogan and Kelly Bentley.

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
