BPW International

BPW International Congress took place in Cairo Egypt from October 23 until 27, 2017. Our agenda was ambitious with:

Monday: Regional Meetings, Pre-Congress Board Meeting & Opening Ceremonies Tuesday: Plenary Speakers and Workshops

Wednesday: Workshops, Business Sessions (Reports), Gala Dinner Thursday: Business Sessions (Constitutional Amendments, Reports)

Friday: Business Sessions (Resolutions, Elections, Budget)
followed by the Post-Congress Board Meeting

n Monday, members attended their regional meetings followed by information sessions about the proposed resolutions and constitutional changes. Later representatives from each country attended the pre-congress board meeting. On Monday evening, everyone attended the Opening Ceremonies and President's Dinner at the Giza Plateau located at the foot of the pyramids in front of the Sphinx. Entertainment included music, renowned opera singers and a historic sound and light show recounting the building of the pyramids.

On Tuesday, members attended plenary sessions about Realizing Sustainable Development Goals, Women Leadership in Ancient Egypt and the Economic Empowerment of Women. In the afternoon members attended a number of workshops.

On Wednesday, members attended plenary sessions about Advancing women through STEM, BPW Making a Difference through Leadership and Action and Trade, Financial Inclusion, procurement policies for Women Enterprises. In the afternoon observers attended a number of workshops while delegates attended the business session. Minutes and Board reports were presented. In the evening, everyone attended the Gala Dinner and Award Ceremony at the Citadel. Entertainment included music, an opera singer, cultural dancing and individual entertainers in the crowd. BPW Ontario received the Power to Make a Difference third place award for Excellent Advocacy for Women. Awarded because of our direct involvement with the Ontario Minister of Labour in the Gender Wage Gap Steering Committee and the Working Group appointed to follow-up on the recommendations submitted.

On Thursday, after several panel discussions and workshops, we heard Board reports and worked on the Constitutional changes. Of the seven proposed amendment's, five were approved. Meetings went late and were followed by, the Friends and Fellows Dinner and the Young BPW Girls Night Out-Nile Dinner Cruise.

On Friday, BPW International Board Elections were followed by the resolutions. All eleven resolutions were approved. The meeting ran late and was followed by approval of the budget and the Post-Congress Board Meeting for the Affiliates.

Over 800 women attended from every Region of BPW International. The evening events were specular and a true celebration of our work. Business was conducted smoothly considering the enormous size of this event and the many languages and barriers to understanding. Translation was available but all business sessions were conduct in English as most presenters preferred to speak English.

On a personal note, I was honoured to Chair the Resolutions portion of the Congress and present at one of the workshops as well as facilitate the resolutions workshop. I was thrilled to reconnect with many women I had previously met and happy to get to know so many, many more. I was extremely proud of our BPW Canada delegation and the lasting impression I am sure each and every member made on our BPW sisters around the world. I explored Egypt and their rich and beautiful history and had many new and wonderful adventures. This Congress will forever live in my memory.

hen BPW was first started the main purpose of BPW and its various chapters was to bring awareness to Women's rights and to ensure that we as a collective could make a change as to how women were perceived within the community. We want to be treated as equals and have our voices heard as a collective.
