e want to thank you for your amazing support so far for the Project ONroute. We are making history with Farmtown Canada/Courage for Freedom with this

project. Key Project dates to put in your calendars: **February 22, 2019** (sign up to e-invite or personally attend MPP's office) – Shhhhhhh: if you are going to see your MPP before this date, please don't tell them about the project – it is a surprise.

**July 30, 2019** (sign up to attend an ONroute location at 9:30 a.m. sharp).

We are continuing to fundraise for the project. The fundraising model: 1-9-99 was created by a survivor. The "1" refers to the individual who makes a \$25 donation. Then that individual reaches out to "9" of her contacts and they donate \$25. Then each of this "9" reach out to "9" of their contacts and they donate and viola, we have "99" donations. Each donation of \$25 or more receives a tax receipt. This is how simple the model is. BPW Ontario's website now has a designated section for our Anti-Human Sex Trafficking initiative under "Advocacy". Here is the link:



# Following is a feature excerpt of Dear Paddy from BPW Brampton's 60th Anniversary:

#### Paddy Silverthorne 1993

Paddy was born in Dublin, Ireland where she lived until her mother died in 1936. She and her two sisters were sent to a convent school where they finished their education. Paddy, the eldest then went to live with her father in Scotland. At the outbreak of World War II, she was conscripted and sent on a crash course in engineering after which she was sent to work in England for the duration of the War. It was there, she met and married her husband Bob. Deirdre was born there. After the War, they moved to Canada. They made a short return to England and then back to Canada to stay. Paddy went to work at American Motors (now Chrysler) as a receptionist for 22 ½ years. She continued to work for Chrysler on a part time basis in an interactive way. Paddy joined the Brampton BPW in 1983 and is instrumental in the Club's success. She has chaired several Committees and currently holds our History and Fellowship Chair. She was the Club's President from 1987 to 1989. Paddy is a tireless worker. Her wit and charm have endeared her to every member.




