
Provincial Report Barb Hore

We are excited that both organizations will soon be engaged in worldwide projects of common interest. The agreement was launched Oct 1st 2014 while we attended an invitation from Dr. Sam Shee and his wife Isabel in Chicago, Illinois.

Sam and Isabel held a reception honoring both International presidents which was attended by some 80 guests including the Hon. Sheila Simon, Lt. Governor of the State of Illinois, the Hon. Nancy Rotering, Mayor of Hyland Park, Chevalier Patrick Rea, International Grand Commander – Knights Templar International, Dr. Gloria Groom, Curator of the Art Institute of Chicago, and several other government and civic VIPS.

Representing BPW International were Past International Presidents Yvette Swan, Tuulikki Juusela and Liz Benham, executive members Amany Asfour, Susan Jones, Bessie Hironimus, Marta Solimano, and members Luisa Monini, Francesca Burack, Kathleen Ray, Mary Lou Lowry, Barbara Yong, and my daughter Yasmin El Sayah. n behalf of Cathy, thanks very much for the speaker invitation and the opportunity to connect with BPW members.

Cathy mentioned that your group was quite interested in two of the tools we have available here at the CCAC, namely the 310-CCAC phone number and www.centralwesthealthline.ca, a comprehensive database of resources available in our community. I have included a very brief overview of both in case it may be of use!

1. www.centralwesthealthline.ca is a comprehensive website that brings up-to-date information about health services to the fingertips of residents and care providers across the Central West region. Users can choose to receive local information first, or search the entire Central West region. A companion site, www.thehealthline.ca, is also available for people seeking information about services and supports available in other regions of Ontario. In addition to service listings, both sites also include health events, news, careers and library sections.

2. 310-CCAC (2222) is a free telephone service provided by Community Care Access Centres (CCACs) across Ontario. It provides comprehensive, up-to-date information about and access to home and community-based health care supports, resources and services. No area code is required and the call is free; live operators are available to answer questions from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm, seven days a week, 365 days a year.

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
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
