n October 25th Pearl McCabe, Barb Hore and myself visited long time BPW member, **Anne Felesko** at her nursing home in St. Catherines to present her with her 55 Year Service Certificate from BPW Canada.

Anne, who is now into her early 90's seemed very happy to see us, particularly Pearl whom she had known for over forty years. They had met when Anne was the property manager in Pearl's apartment building, the one in which Pearl still resides.

Anne came to Brampton in 1967 from Kirkland Lake and was a very active BPW Brampton member serving in many executive positions including that of Club President from 1970 to 1972. Most notably, Anne will be remembered for preparing and delivering a petition to the Brampton Town Council in 1968 which resulted in the Municipality of Brampton implementing the Franchise Extension Act which allowed Brampton women to vote.

She attended numerous Provincial Conferences and was a mentor to many new members. She worked tirelessly to promote our club's growth and in the promotion of our BPW mandate.



Resolutions Olga Gil

The Resolutions Committee received four ideas for possible Resolutions for 2013. Two have been researched and withdrawn.

- 1 Diabetes: Provision of free needles for insulin injection to be provided to those over 65. An annual grant of \$170 is available from the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care, Assistive Devices Program for those over 65 who use insulin on a daily basis. This is to cover the cost of needles and syringes.
- 2 Treatment of prisoners with mental problems: The inquest into Ashley Smith's death has revealed that prisoners are sometimes treated inhumanely. The inquest will be making recommendations on changes. It has been decided to wait until these are published and then support, reject, etc. as we see fit. This will make the topic one for next year. Two other topics are being explored for resolutions:
- **3** Provincial: Domestic violence in the immigrant and new Canadian community.
- 4 Nationally: Operating agreements between Cooperative Housing Federations and the federal government.
- Tune-in, in January.

s president and founder of the **BUDDYS** 'n BOWS FOUNDATION, I would like to take this opportunity to express my sincere gratitude to the BPW Brampton Chapter for their continued support of our organization as a community partner. We have celebrated our 5th Anniversary in 2012 and the BPW has been a constant support, with volunteers and cash donations from golf tournaments.

We have been able, in the last year, to expand our CARING COMPANION PROGRAM at the Brampton Civic Hospital's Pediatrics Department to the Etobicoke Hospital Pediatrics Department as well. We made an additional donation of \$6,000.00 to top up the annual budget for these programs, which is \$18,000.00, and administered by the Osler Foundation.

Also, we have been busy with establishing a program within the Long Term Care facility of the hospital which provides a "HEALING THROUGH RHYTHM" program using therapeutic drumming. The monthly sessions of therapeutic drumming encourage patients recuperating from a fall or fracture or neurological conditions such as a stroke or multiple sclerosis (MS) to participate in an activity that will help with their physical stamina, motor function and coordination. We have provided a \$2,800.00 donation for a year's commitment of this program which we intend to expand into other areas of senior care in our community.

We continue to run euchre tournaments and currently planning a major fundraiser in May 2013. We are in the process of organizing a Car Rally / BBQ for May 5th, 2013. Details to follow. Also, a euchre tournament is planned for Sunday, January 20th, 2013 at Spot One. We would love to see you out for this event.
