orld Food Day is a day of action dedicated to tackling global

hunger. One of the most celebrated day in the United Nations calendar. It's an annual celebration in the honour of the Food and Agriculture Organization launched by the United Nations in 1945. It is one of the UN Sustainable Development

Goal - # 2 Zero Hunger. Zero



Hunger is based on three dimensions economic, social, and environmental. Zero Hunger aims to end hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition, and promote sustainable agriculture by 2030.

Decades of decline in the world UN is not on track in achieving Zero Hunger by 2030.

Some estimates indicate by 2050 approximately 2.6 billion people globally will suffer from food insecurity. Largely due to man-made conflicts, climate change, economic downturn and COVID measures.

Significant changes of the global food and agriculture system UN recommends:

- Meet the needs of the vulnerable population;
- Social protection of food programs;
- Keep global food trade going;
- Keep domestic food supply chain going;
- Support small farms.

In summary, it calls on all countries to build better food systems more resilient and robust so they can withstand volatility, climate shocks and deliver sustainable food for all and decent livelihoods for food workers.

BPW Brampton is raising the awareness on food insecurity by highlighting the great work Ste. Louise Food Bank does in our community. At our next General Meeting in October 2022 our members will be donating food items to Ste Louise Food Bank. Our Club also we donating proceeds from our November 11 2022 Progressive Euchre Event to Ste Louise Food Bank.

BPW Brampton is challenging all clubs in Ontario to mobilize with their local food bank on October 16 2022 to raise local awareness of food insecurity and answer the basic call to humanity everyone should have access to FOOD.



Focus on Member Susan Fennell Sheila Walker



he longest serving Mayor and first woman Mayor of the City of Brampton was most known for her energy, smile, genuine affection and devotion for the citizens she served. Susan was often referred to as the People's Mayor, attending not only to her Council, administrative and economic development responsibilities, but also tirelessly supporting countless people, organizations, seniors, community groups, faith groups, sports and arts groups. Her positive energy was always put to work boosting Brampton. As Mayor, Susan has many numerous accolades while in office.


- Susan delivered the first new recreation facilities in over a decade including The Brampton Soccer Centre, Cassie Campbell Community Centre, Gore Meadows Community Centre, Brampton Seniors Flowercity Centre, and insisted on the upgrade and renovation of many existing Recreation Centres.
- Susan's great respect for the Arts and Culture in Brampton resulted in her leading Council to approve and build a Performing Arts Centre known as the Rose Theatre regarded as one of the finest stages in the Province.
- Susan focussed on attracting jobs bringing major employers to Brampton Air Canada Global Operations Centre, Canon Canada and Medtronics. Brampton was recognized as an Employer of Choice
- Through an expanded public garden program, Susan saw Brampton's Flower Town heritage restored making a significant commitment to its ongoing maintenance through participation in the international Communities in Bloom Program resulting in Brampton being recognized as an International Champion.
- Brampton was also recognized as an International Safe Community by the World Health Organization in 2007 and 2012.
 Only 10 cities in North America achieve this accreditation.
- Under Susan's leadership, Brampton saw an unprecedented 25+ properties designated under the Ontario Heritage Act, a 100% increase over the previous 20 years. Susan was instrumental in stopping the sale and demolition of the Chisholm Estate, Alderlea, Brampton's most significant historic residential building and purchase Alderlea and it was fully restored. The Estate is now a premier meeting and event facility in historic Downtown.
- Susan has been recognized for her dedication and involvement in Brampton with the Canada 125 Medal, and both the Queen Elizabeth II Gold and Diamond Jubilee Medals being honoured by Scouts Canada with the Lord Baden Powell Medal. The Rotary Club made Susan a Paul Harris Fellow; She was awarded the Zonta Club Woman of Achievement.
- Susan has been inducted into the Brampton Sports Hall of Fame for her dedication to Women's Hockey development at the Olympic Senior level. Susan founded the National Women's Hockey League and invited Governor General Adrienne Clarkson to name the Championship Cup, The Clarkson Cup as Governor General Lord Stanley did for the men's hockey many years before.
- Susan is a member of Ladies Auxiliary of Royal Canadian Legion Branch 15 and is a member to our Club, Brampton Business and Professional Women's Club.
- Susan continues to be a much sought after public speaker. Representing Canada at a special Government Communication study at Harvard University and at the Microsoft Annual Convention in Atlanta.
- In recognition of Susan's dedication and achievements, Brampton City Council renamed the Sportsplex to the Susan Fennell Sportsplex, housing 4 hockey rinks, a library, pool and Centre for Youth.
- Personally, Susan has been married to her husband John for 45 years. Susan was born in Montreal, has two adult sons, Michael and Joseph and is a new very proud Grandma. Susan and John continue to live in Brampton close to Susan's brother Don Biefer.
