Vice-President of Young BPW Canada, and I have also been

re-elected as Chair of Young BPW Brampton Caledon. During the time I hold these positions, I will do my best to encourage Young BPWs and other young women to learn, grow, and advance in their professional and/or educational ambitions. I also want to encourage increased membership of Young BPWs and collaboration between Young BPWs. The first project that I have implemented toward achieving this goal is a Google Classroom that is exclusive to Young BPW Canada members and advisors. There are currently seven people registered. This platform will be the centralized hub for all things Young BPW Canada. I will also be hosting the initial Young BPW Canada meeting on Wednesday, September 18th at 7:15pm EST. These meetings will most likely be held monthly from September - May each year.

As the newly elected Vice-President of Young BPW Canada, I wanted to ensure that the committee is engaging in projects that are in line with BPW's mandate. That is why we have started our first official national project. It will be a petition to the Government of Canada that asks them to implement a nation-wide Red Dress Alert System. Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls (MMIWGs) is a detrimental, ongoing, and intergenerational issue. It requires much more attention, along with the implementation of preventive projects that will also help with working toward redress and reconciliation.

I will also be leading my first Young BPW International Project. I am currently in the

registration/planning process. The project is to write a thoroughly researched, fact-based, informative, and persuasive open letter addressed to the Government of India, demanding that they declare violence against women and girls (VAWGs) a "national crisis". This is a term that the Indian government has used to classify nation-wide natural disasters, such as pollution, the COVID-19 pandemic, floods, and poor water quality. VAWGs is equally, if not more detrimental and should be classified accordingly. Our main goals are to spread awareness internationally, educate the public, and encourage the Government of India to take action by declaring VAWGs a national crisis.

n September 21st, the BPW Brampton Caledon Club hosted a virtual workshop with sandra Sharpe on Navigating Conflict Conversations. Sandra Sharpe is a Certified Municipal Manager III, Trained Mediator and Facilitator, and Government Relations, Public Policy, and

Ċ.

Communications Professional.

The workshop was tively and thought-provoking. During the workshop, Sandra opened by acknowledging the Truth and Reconciliation date of September 30th. She then walked the group through the anatomy of conflict and how to move from conflict conversations to creative dialogue and build respectful relationships.

Participants' reflective comments included, 'Conflict at its core is driven by HOW we react to situations,' Conflict comes from a lack of structure and understanding of people and their perceptions regarding many aspects of life, 'Conflict is harmful to your life and health, 'Do you want to be right or effective?' short-term pain for long-term gain,' and 'It's the conversations we don't have that are harmful.' The participants shared many insightful views.

In all conflict situations, we bring our 'personal' resume of our past experiences and trauma. Through the workshop, we learned we have several brains. The red brain is in survival mode and engages in emotion; it's always checking for life-or-death situations and is trained to protect your life. This is where most of us go when engaging in conflict. The blue brain is our thinking brain. Engaging this brain takes a great deal of energy. The larger question in the workshop is how we shift from the red to the blue brain. How do you show up? Are you staying focused on the higher vision?

Navigating conflict respectfully involves mindful strategies such as taking a deep breath and pausing, asking questions with genuine curiosity, and listening, listening, listening. It is also important to find a middle ground or mutually acceptable solution that addresses the needs and interests of all parties involved. Focus on the question or problem rather than the person.

The tips shared included active listening, making eye contact, giving your partner your full attention as they speak, responding appropriately, maintaining a conversational tone, and keeping your body language respectful, engaged, and open. It also uses "I" statements that express feelings instead of assigning blame.

Many people do not find HR assistance helpful, and therefore, contacting someone with Sandy's expertise is a viable option.

Local Focus

Provincial

Our club submitted three resolutions for 2024. These resolutions were discussed, debated, and voted on at the BPW Ontario conference in May. All three resolutions were unanimously carried. They are included in the BPW Ontario brief to the provincial government's relevant ministries and opposition parties.

Many thanks to Victim Services of Peel, our community partner, for partnering with the BPW Brampton Caledon Resolutions Committee.

The provincial focus for 2025 includes reaffirming pay equity, education, and health-related resolutions.

Federal

The BPW Canada Conference was held in Moncton, New Brunswick, from August 9 to 12, 2024. The BPW Brampton Caledon Resolution Committee submitted one national resolution on "The Prioritization and Inclusion of Femicide in Canada's Criminal Code." This resolution was unanimously carried. It will be included in the BPW Canada brief to the federal government's relevant ministries and opposition parties. For this coming club year, I'm researching the inequalities in the taxation of single seniors relative to couples, the clawbacks of benefits that singles experience, and a review of the taxation of RRSP/RRIF assets on the death of a single senior. With women living longer, this could be a potential federal resolution.

International Update

In 2023, the BPW Brampton Caledon Club submitted a federal resolution on Women's Access to Health Services and Health Education through Technology. The global community will mark the thirtieth anniversary of the Fourth World Conference on Women and the adoption of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action (1995).

BPW Canada has ECOSOC-accredited nongovernmental organization (NGO) status.

The sixty-ninth session's primary focus will be reviewing and appraising the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action and the outcomes of the 23rd special session of the General Assembly. If you are interested in participating, please contact Mina Di Domenico.


