Kiva is a global nonprofit focused on expanding financial access to underserved communities, empowering individuals to create economic opportunity and financial stability. By providing fair access to capital, Kiva helps women and girls afford education, enables women to start businesses, supports farmers with equipment investments, and helps families cover emergency healthcare costs.

Kiva loans are repaid to individual lenders, who do not receive interest, making it a philanthropic effort. However, the ability to relend after repayment magnifies the impact, far beyond a one-time donation.

Since launching this initiative in November 2023, we've funded 6 loans across 6 countries (Congo DRC, Indonesia, Nicaragua, Tajikistan, Peru, and Ecuador) in support of women who are positively impacting their communities. To date, we've loaned a total of \$1,000, with \$535 repaid, allowing us to continue relending and supporting more women.

Current Loans Highlights:



Ana Belen (Ecuador) – \$125

Loaned: December 2024 | Repayments Expected to Begin: March 2025 Ana operates a supply rental business for social events, providing custom decorations, delivery, and setup. This loan will help her purchase essential items like tables, chairs, linens, and drinkware,

supporting the growth and expansion of her business.



Madina (Tajikistan) – \$125 Loaned: September 2024 | 6% Repaid Madina, an X-ray specialist in a rural village, is seeking funds to upgrade her X-ray machine. The new equipment will provide clearer radiographs, improving diagnostic accuracy and treatment outcomes for the local community.



Sustainable Artisan Development Project (Peru) – \$250

Loaned: January 2024 | 11% Repaid
This project provides training, market access, and higher income opportunities for over 250 artisans in northern Peru, many of whom are women from indigenous communities. By establishing a home-work

economy, the project enables artisans to balance their work with caregiving roles, leading to a 25% increase in household earnings for those in extreme poverty.

Fully Repaid Loans:

Kana Group (Congo DRC) - \$100

Loaned: April 2024 | Fully Repaid: December 2024 Helped purchase wholesale boards to supplement initial capital, supporting entrepreneurs in conflict-affected regions with limited opportunities.

Gotitas De Esperanza 1 Group (Nicaragua) – \$100 Loaned: April 2024 | Fully Repaid: November 2024 Funded business supplies to empower women through community support and financial training.

Nazava Water Filters (Indonesia) – \$250

Loaned: January 2024 | Fully Repaid: May 2024 Contributed to pre-ordering 40,000 water systems, providing safe drinking water to 200,000 people.





BPW Resolutions, By-Laws Update Ming Di Domenico

Phenomenal Women

Do you know an inspiring woman in our community who has demonstrated remarkable dedication to uplifting women, girls, and gender-diverse individuals? What makes her a role model to you? Provincial Resolution Update

One proposed resolution focuses on improving Ontario's Mental Health Act. Suggested enhancements include expanding access to mental health resources and support to reduce the need for hospitalization. This resolution remains a work in progress and continues to evolve through ongoing discussions and input.

Federal Resolutions Update

We are actively refining three federal-level resolutions proposed by our club:

Federal Income Tax Fairness for Single Seniors

A virtual meeting will be held on February 11th to delve into this topic in detail. Please mark your calendar and join us to contribute to the discussion and explore ways to promote tax fairness for single seniors.

<u>Criminalizing Coercive Control in Intimate Relationships</u>

This resolution builds on last year's proposal to include femicide as a priority in Canada's Criminal Code. Bill C-332, a Canadian private member's bill, aims to criminalize coercive control—non-physical forms of abuse such as emotional, financial, or psychological manipulation that restricts a partner's independence. Examples include isolating a partner from loved ones, controlling their finances, or instilling fear of violence. Recognizing coercive control as a common precursor to physical violence, the bill seeks to address a critical aspect of domestic abuse.

Supporting Afghan Women and Girls

Since the Taliban's takeover of Afghanistan in August 2021, the rights of women and girls have been systematically erased. They face extreme oppression, including bans on education beyond sixth grade, restrictions on employment, and severe limitations on movement without a male guardian. The Taliban's policies have created the world's most repressive environment for women and girls, necessitating immediate international advocacy and support.

International Update

In 2023, the BPW Brampton Caledon Club successfully submitted a federal resolution on Women's Access to Health Services and Health Education through Technology. The resolution was adopted at the November BPW International Congress in St. Kitts & Nevis—a significant achievement for the club and a step forward in advocating for women's health globally. <u>February 15</u>: Club members will review and vote on the intent of the three federal resolutions.

 $\underline{\text{March 1}}$: The club's deadline for submitting federal resolutions to BPW Canada.

<u>April 1</u>: A virtual meeting will review all provincial resolutions submitted by clubs across the province. BPW Brampton Caledon Members will discuss, debate, and provide voting directions to club delegates for the BPW Ontario AGM. Feedback from other clubs on our submitted provincial resolutions will also be shared.

April 8: A virtual meeting will review all nationwide federal resolutions clubs submit. This is the same process as above for the BPW Canada AGM. Feedback from other clubs on our submitted federal resolutions will also be considered. Ongoing updates and refinements will be shared with members as the resolution cycle.

Public Affairs Update Ontario

The Ontario government continues to focus on addressing gender-based violence, enhancing support for women's economic empowerment, and promoting leadership opportunities for women and girls. Recent initiatives include funding for violence prevention programs and efforts to address barriers faced by women in the workforce, particularly in STEM and skilled trades. Advocacy groups (*see below) are also pushing for greater accessibility in reproductive healthcare and affordable childcare, recognizing these as essential for advancing gender equality across the province.

*In Ontario, several advocacy groups focus on gender equality and women's rights. One key organization is the Gender Equality Coalition of Ontario (GECO), which promotes gender justice through raising awareness, providing resources, and working toward policy change. GECO emphasizes intersectional inclusion and diversity, advocating for gender equality across all genders, races, and abilities.

Another prominent group is the Ontario Federation of Labour (OFL), which leads campaigns against gender-based violence, including the 16 Days of Activism. The OFL advocates for women's rights to safety and equity, focusing on issues such as technology-facilitated sexual violence.

Canada

At the federal level, the Canadian government is advancing its National Action Plan to End Gender-Based Violence, with new funding allocated to shelters, prevention initiatives, and services for survivors. Additionally, discussions around Bill C-332, which seeks to criminalize coercive control in intimate relationships, highlight ongoing efforts to strengthen protections for women in abusive situations.

International

Canada has been playing a significant role in advancing gender equality internationally, notably through its leadership in the United Nations (UN) and its engagement in global initiatives to achieve the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The Canadian government, mainly through Women and Gender Equality Canada (WAGE), has been instrumental in advancing SDG 5 (gender equality) and SDG 10 (reducing inequalities), focusing on initiatives such as gender-based violence prevention, enhancing the capacity of women's organizations, and supporting policies for economic and social inclusion of marginalized groups. Canada has also significantly contributed to implementing the National Action Plan to End Gender-Based Violence and international partnerships to support gender equality.

The 69th session of the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW69) will occur from March 10 to 21, 2025, at the United Nations Headquarters in New York. This session will primarily focus on reviewing the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, marking its 30th anniversary. Discussions will assess progress on gender equality, identify existing challenges, and strategize on actions to enhance women's empowerment and realize the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). This review is significant, as it will guide future efforts toward achieving gender equality and women's empowerment worldwide.

This program year, the focus has shifted to enhancing the club's social media strategy. I created a comprehensive strategy document and shared it with the executive team. The committee is now working on establishing norms, calendars, and operating procedures to guide our efforts. Thank you to Angela and Nelia for volunteering to be part of the committee.
