UN Women, CSW69 / Beijing+30 (2025)

In 2025, the global community will mark the thirtieth anniversary of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action (1995), adopted at the Fourth World Conference on Women. The 69th session of the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW69) will take place at the United Nations Headquarters in New York from March 10 to 21, 2025.

BPW Canada will have 20 delegates participating as ECOSOC-accredited NGOs. I am honoured to have been selected again this year.

Single Seniors Virtual Event Recap BPW Brampton Caledon Hosts Nationwide Virtual Educational Event on Single Seniors for Tax Fairness

n February 11th, BPW Brampton Caledon, in partnership with the BPW Online Club, hosted a nationwide virtual educational event on Single Seniors for Tax Fairness. The session attracted 67 engaged participants eager to understand better the financial challenges single seniors face under current tax policies.

The discussion shed light on the inequities in federal income tax laws, particularly how they disproportionately

impact single seniors, especially women. Factors such as gender-based income disparities, caregiving responsibilities, and longer life expectancy contribute to the financial vulnerability of single senior women, making tax fairness a critical issue.

Elizabeth Brown, Director of SSTF, delivered an insightful and well-structured presentation, covering essential topics such as:

Recent Recommendations to the Federal Finance
Committee

- Inequities Between Single Seniors and Couples
- Tax Clawbacks Impacting Single Seniors

 Tax Treatment of RRSP/RRIF Assets After the Death of a Single Senior

The event sparked meaningful engagement, reinforced the urgency of addressing these inequities, and encouraged attendees to take action.

To that end, BPW Brampton Caledon has developed a federal resolution to advocate for change. This resolution was shared with members via email, and the details are located on the club's website in the Member's Area—Advocacy Folder.

Celebrating International Women's Day The Impact of Women in Canada, Ontario, Brampton and Caledon Mina Di Domenico

very year on March 8th, the world celebrates International Women's Day (IWD) - a time to reflect on women's achievements while continuing the call for gender equality. In Canada, and specifically in Ontario, Brampton, and Caledon, women have played a vital role in shaping communities and

fostering progress. Canada has a proud history of trailblazing women who fought for equality and made lasting contributions. From the Famous Five - who championed women's legal recognition as persons - to leaders like former Governor General Adrienne Clarkson and Astronaut Roberta Bondar, Canadian women continue to break barriers. Today, women lead in government, business, technology, and activism, shaping the nation's future.

Ontario has been home to influential women making strides in politics, education, and industry. **Kathleen Wynne**, Ontario's first female premier, and **Dr. Jean Augustine**, the first Black woman elected to Canada's Parliament, paved the way for future generations. Across sectors, women continue to push for policies supporting equal pay, parental leave, and inclusive workplaces.



Brampton, a diverse and growing city, has seen women drive economic growth, social justice, and cultural enrichment. Through leadership in business, education, and grassroots activism, they empower youth, promote entrepreneurship, and advance sustainability.

Susan Fennell (2000–2014): Brampton's first female Mayor, serving 14 years, advocating for economic development and community initiatives. She also founded the National Women's Hockey League.

Linda Jeffrey (2014–2018): Former MPP and Minister, she worked toward policy reforms and community engagement.

Sara Singh (2018–2022): MPP for Brampton Centre and the first Indo-Caribbean woman elected to Ontario's Legislature.

Charmaine Williams (2022–Present): The first Black woman elected to Brampton City Council, now Ontario's Associate Minister of Women's Social and Economic Opportunity.

Christina Early (2018–Present): A dedicated Caledon Regional Councillor, she has strongly advocated for responsible growth, infrastructure improvements, and community well-being.

In Caledon, women have been instrumental in preserving the environment, supporting local agriculture, and strengthening community networks. Whether in municipal leadership, conservation efforts, or small businesses, they ensure sustainable growth while maintaining Caledon's charm.

Marolyn Morrison (2003–2014): Former Mayor, focussed on sustainable development and environmental conservation.

Sylvia Jones (2007–Present): MPP for Dufferin–Caledon, holding key roles, including Ontario's Deputy Premier and Minister of Health.

Lynn Kiernan (2018 to present): A dedicated Caledon Councillor and Community Leader, Lynn serves as a Commissioner with the Niagara Escarpment Commission on the Board of Directors for Caledon Meals on Wheels.

KIVA UPDATE Amanda Graham-Rowe

Kiva Project: Empowering Women Worldwide

This year, we continue our commitment to supporting women globally through our Kiva project. By partnering with Kiva, a non-profit organization, we have expanded financial access to underserved communities. Our Kiva loans specifically target women and girls, focusing on their education and entrepreneurship.

BPW Brampton currently has three active loans contributing to the well-being of women internationally, while also positively impacting their communities:

1. Sustainable Artisan Development Project (Peru)

- **Purpose:** Provide training, market access, and higher incomes for over 250 artisans.
- Loan Amount: \$250 (one of 1,472 lenders for a total loan of \$50,000)
- **Repayment Status:** 11% repaid, 7 payments behind. No recent comments or updates. Monitoring continues.
